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Summer Camp 2021

Greetings from The Farmhouse Center

Hello friends,

We are all very excited to be amongst our campers. In this time of the COVID pandemic, safety and procedures are a top priority. Parents are asked to drop off the students (parents stay in car) at the front porch wearing a mask. At that time a temperature reading is taken. Any student with an abnormal temperature will be asked to return to their parent and not be admitted to camp. Temperatures are taken every day.

The first session starts on June 14th. We are fortunate in that the majority of our activities are outside and we form small groups with social distancing. Masks are required to be worn at all times.

Please feel free to call me with any comments or questions 872-8712. I am always available for you. A waiver has been provided and should be returned with the application and payment in advance to reserve a space.

I wanted to also include a list of items to bring to camp. Extra face masks with campers' name in a zip lock bag. All medicines must be handed to Ms. Joan with instructions. Sun block is required and bug spray is also recommended.

Campers are asked to arrive in long pants and sneakers. No sandals are allowed out at the barn, but please bring sandals for the afternoon along with shorts, extra socks, towel and bathing suit. Please watch weather for forecasts of rain or cooler weather and bring a jacket and sweatshirt on those days.

Since we are outside a majority of the day, it is important to come to camp with sunscreen already applied. Bring extra to keep in your bag. All medications must be kept with me and with a written note for directions in a zip lock bag. We also have doggies and kitties if you have pet allergies.

Bring a water bottle. We have delicious water on the farm to refill your bottles. Bring a snack for the morning, your lunch and a snack for the afternoon. We cook every day and usually prepare a savory or sweet snack each day. Every Friday is our farm picnic for lunch! It is

delicious and the campers are the chefs. We also love our cooking challenges each week. If you have any allergies or special dietary requirements, please let me know. Out of caution, I ask that you do not bring items containing nuts of any sort.

The campers will be planting gardens and sunflowers squash, lettuce, spinach and herbs that I have started for planting. The campers will also seed their own pumpkins and squash.

We have an in-ground swimming pool which everyone loves! We have very strict rules. Parents are responsible to bring a life jacket and everyone must pass my swim test to use the pool without a jacket. There is a shallow and deep end. We have olympic races, yoga and synchronized swimming, drawing with chalk, and our nail salon. Please enforce the fact that the lifeguards are very strict.

Our horse activities are so much fun! We work with the horses every morning. The riding takes place in the morning when it is cool outside. We spend an ample amount of time teaching safety around the horses. We have great counselors who are looking out for your safety. The miniature horses are very excited to be with everyone and take their walks in the pasture and of course their beauty pageant parades.

I can't wait to see you all and have an absolutely wonderful time!
